EDIT Collaboration Newsletter: March 2024



Study Updates

Data processing – We have mapped variables from 75% of trials to the EDIT IPD variables (13 adolescent trials, 15 adult trials). Data re-coding is underway with 8 trials complete, and quality assessments are in progress.

Data harmonisation process – We have now proposed an approach to harmonise >50 individual participant variables across adolescent and adult trials. These decisions will be documented in our Statistical Analysis Plan. **Statistical analysis plan** – We are drafting the statistical analysis plan and will circulate this to Collaborators once complete.

Intervention deconstruction – All trials have been coded. The deadline for verification has now passed, and 43 of 48 included EDIT trials have been verified – thank you to everyone who contributed. Data cleaning and analysis has commenced from this week, and we are presenting preliminary results to Collaborators early May. Dr Lister will be presenting these findings at the European Congress on Obesity in Venice 12-15 May 2024.

About the webinar: People with chronic physical health conditions report body image concerns. Yet, body image is not routinely addressed in healthcare, and rates of help-seeking are low. This presentation will discuss studies addressing key gaps to inform body image enhancement in this group. First, it will discuss learnings from the development of a cognitive behavioural body image group program for adults with a chronic illness which employed co-design, and the importance of body functionality in this context. Second, findings from recent studies examining knowledge and beliefs about body image, and their implications, will be considered to guide future research and practice in this important domain.

Dr Kristen Murray is a Clinical Psychologist, Senior Lecturer and Master of Professional Psychology Program Convenor in the School of Medicine and Psychology at the ANU. Her research aims to improve health and well-being through a focus on body image, including its etiology, measurement, and impact. She takes a holistic approach by integrating diverse aspects of body image, applying these in novel domains, and developing education and intervention programs. Her current projects include a focus on understanding and addressing (i) functional body image, (ii) body image in chronic illness, (iii) knowledge and beliefs about body image in community and health professionals, and (iv) enhancing measurement across these domains.
